On 8/18/81, William Closner, Sheriff, Skamania County Sheriff's Office, Stevenson, Washington, advised Dr. James A. Roman, Date of Birth 10/9/27, shot his wife and killed himself on 2/3/80 after allegedly assaulting an individual in Portland, Oregon. He said his office investigated the homicide/suicide and while doing so, discovered the Roman residence was filled with numerous weapons. He stated that also found were scanners capable of monitoring numerous police frequencies. Sheriff Closner stated Roman was either a paratrooper or did some sky-diving, was a previous employee of NASA, and apparently continued to have some interest in parachuting. He said the Roman residence, located at Milepost 0.56R Strunk Road, Washougal, Washington, was in the flightpath of the aircraft carrying D.B. Cooper. He said that based on the above stated facts it appears as if Roman should be looked at by the FBI as a possible D.B. Cooper suspect.

Sheriff Closner said he was not aware of Roman's description or further identifying data. He said [redacted]







He is a [redacted] and, as such, did some [redacted] at the time, to Dr. James Roman. Subsequently, Roman [redacted]

In January or February of 1980, he received a telephone call from [redacted] indicating that she had heard Dr. Roman went to Portland and shot someone. He, [redacted] subsequently determined that Roman had killed his new wife and committed suicide at his home in Washougal, Washington. He, [redacted] went to the Roman home in Washougal, which is located in Skamania County, and secured the home, because he was asked to do so.

While securing the residence, he conducted a thorough search and found numerous items he felt might be of interest to the FBI. He found a toolbox in the barn, which was dirty and rusty. Underneath numerous tools, he found two timing devices that could be utilized with batteries. He further found, buried in the dirt floor of the barn, a container with a box that said, "Silencer" on it. The box was empty. He found a police scanner in Roman's wife's purse, which had frequencies for the Portland Police Bureau, the Clark County Sheriff's Office and the Skamania County Sheriff's Office. He discovered two lock-picking kits in the residence, along with dynamite, blasting caps and plastic explosives.

Other items he discovered included a Xerox machine, a printing press with many different types of type and numerous documents that appeared to him to be "phony." He felt these documents were not authentic, inasmuch as there were numerous of them, indicating they were such things as college certificates.

He also found a large quantity of camera equipment, including a dark room.

He discovered numerous documents from hospitals, alleging Dr. Roman erred in his surgical procedures. One of these documents indicated that Dr. Roman, after performing a kidney operation on a woman, accidentally cut off the woman's breast.

He further found 30 or more apple boxes, containing books, which indicated they had been taken from various libraries. These books had to do with stories on Hitler, medical books, spy stories and other topics.

He has learned that Dr. Roman was apparently the first doctor to become an astronaut and has found documents which indicate Roman was a jet pilot. In amongst the items indicating Roman was in the United States Air Force, were items marked, "Top Secret." These items, he recalls, also had the stamp of "Declassified" on them.

The majority of the items that he found in the home were provided to the lawyer for the estate for subsequent dispersement to the appropriate relatives.

He is bringing this matter to the attention of the FBI, inasmuch as the whole situation appears to be extremely bizarre to him. While he is in no way certain this matter is involved with the D. B. Cooper matter, it is interesting to note that Dr. Roman was a jet pilot, was apparently knowledgeable of airplanes and resided in an area adjacent to the flight path of Cooper's plane.

On 5/25/82, contact was made with [redacted] [redacted], who was contacted at her place of employment, Vocational Rehabilitation, Department of Social and Health Services, Vancouver, Wash., advised she had been [redacted] and recalled that the D.B. Cooper hi-jacking took place the night before Thanksgiving of that year. She stated [redacted] at least a portion of time between 3:00 pm and 10:00 pm the day before Thanksgiving. She advised ROMAN did not smoke in 1971, had no parachuting experience to her knowledge, and made no flights between Portland and Seattle to her knowledge.

[redacted] indicated ROMAN was born Oct. 9, 1927. After viewing the artist's conception of D.B. Cooper, she stated ROMAN looked nothing like the conception.

[redacted] said she had no reason to protect ROMAN inasmuch as [redacted] by virtue of him killing his present wife and then committing suicide. She said that if she had any information relative to ROMAN's involvement with the D.B. Cooper hi-jacking, she would provide it to the FBI.
