

On 1/31/74, [redacted] U. S. Post Office, Lakeview, Oregon, advised ROGER C. STROM is receiving mail at that post office in care of General Delivery; however, none of the employees know where STROM is residing or is employed.

On 1/31/74, [redacted] Credit Bureau of Lake County, Lakeview, Oregon, advised she could locate no credit record for ROGER C. STROM.

On 1/31/74, Records of the Pacific Power and Light Company, Lakeview, Oregon, were checked and it was determined that ROGER C. STROM was not receiving service from that company.

On 1/31/74, Sheriff DUANE DOWD, Lake County Sheriff's Office, Lakeview, Oregon, advised ROGER C. STROM was unknown to him but stated he would attempt to locate him in order that he may be interviewed.

On 2/15/74, [redacted], Lakeview, Oregon, advised he had developed no new information regarding STROM.

On 2/15/74, Sheriff DUANE DOWD, Lake County Sheriff's Office, advised he has developed no information regarding STROM nor has he determined where STROM is residing or is employed.

On 2/25/74, motels in the Lakeview area were canvassed, and it was determined that ROGER D. STROM was residing at Hunter's Lodge, N. Highway 395, Apt. 11, Lakeview, Oregon.

On 2/25/74, ROGER CLIFFE STROM, Hunter's Lodge, N. Highway 395, Lakeview, Oregon, was interviewed and during this interview, STROM was extremely hostile and uncooperative. It was also noted during the interview, he was nervous and when shown the composite photograph of the individual known as D. B. COOPER, he kept stating it did not look like him, however, refused to look at the photograph directly.

STROM advised he is unemployed, however, would not state when his last employment was. STROM advised he did not recall exactly where he was on 11/24/71, but stated he was probably in the Depoe Bay or Lincoln City, Oregon area.

STROM stated he did not know who D. B. COOPER was nor did he know about any hijacking which occurred on a flight from Seattle, Washington, to Reno, Nevada. During the interview, STROM was advised that the individual known as D. B. COOPER boarded the flight at Portland, Oregon, flew to Seattle, Washington, where he hijacked the air craft. STROM at that time stated he knew nothing about it; however, later in the interview, he stated that that was the guy who "went out the tailgate" although this information was not given to STROM by the Agent. Later in the interview, STROM also made the statement "You guys haven't gotten any of the money back yet, have you?"

It was noted during the interview STROM bears a great deal of resemblance to composite drawing of the individual known as D. B. COOPER. STROM has similar lines around the mouth and eyes as shown on the composite drawing. The nose appears identical, the chin is identical; however, STROM's lips are larger than on the composite drawing. It was also noted that STROM has a slight wave in his hair and parts it on the left as shown in the composite and his hair recedes back on both sides, however, is fuller in the front than that on the composite.

STROM denied ever using the name D. B. COOPER and further denied having any type of parachute training. STROM emphatically denied any involvement in the hijacking which occurred 11/24/71.

STROM refused to furnish any background information regarding himself and merely stated that the FBI can check any records they want on him and get the information they need. When asked what his DOB was, he refused to furnish this; however, later, he took his driver's license out and handed it to the Agent and told Agent he could get all the information he needed off the license.

The following descriptive information regarding ROGER CLIFFE STROM was obtained through observation and interview:

It was also noted that parked at the motel was a foreign model compact station wagon, make unknown, four-door, white in color which bore Oregon license FGW 137 which was previously determined to belong to STROM. This vehicle was observed to have a great many boxes in the back and it was also noted in STROM's motel unit, a large number of boxes laying about the area.

[REDACTED] stated ROGER was employed during 1971 as a truck driver for North American Van Lines. She added STROM lived [REDACTED] in Depot Bay during the time he was employed with North American. She added he received his trip schedules from the Portland Office of North American, and they would probably be able to advise if he was in travel status on 11/24/71. [REDACTED] stated she could not recall whether [REDACTED] was in Depot Bay, or Lincoln City, on 11/24/71.

[REDACTED] thereafter related [REDACTED] was considered a near genius, who served in the U. S. Army during the 1940s, after which he was employed as an aircraft engineer at Boeing Company, Seattle, Washington. She stated STROM was a victim of the Boeing layoffs during 1967. [REDACTED] believed it was during this same period that ROGER [REDACTED] stated as a result of these problems, [REDACTED] was committed by [REDACTED] for mental health reasons to the Veterans Hospital, Seattle, Washington. She noted, however, his stay at the hospital was voluntary, and he was in a position to leave the hospital at any time he desired. [REDACTED] could not recall the period of his commitment.

[redacted] stated [redacted] left his job with North American Van Lines during the summer of 1973. She described him as being a little eccentric, and in one particular area paranoid. She stated the latter was a result of ROGER's belief that people were attempting to poison him. She recalled there were incidents in restaurants where ROGER feared the food he was being served was poisoned. [redacted] further stated [redacted]

[redacted] was very frugal, and for considerable periods of time he survived on one dollar per day, although he had more funds available to him. She noted, however, that ROGER never got much money. [redacted] further recalled

[redacted] was an individual who liked to stay in old motels during his travels. [redacted] was not aware of ROGER's current address. [redacted] stated ROGER was last seen during January, 1974, [redacted], who noticed him in an auto parts store in Lincoln City, Oregon. She stated [redacted] did not engage STROM in any conversation.

[redacted] stated [redacted] had never mentioned the name D. B. COOPER, and never talked of the hijacking of the Northwest Orient aircraft, nor had he ever indicated the possession of a large sum of money.

[redacted] did not believe [redacted] was capable of committing an act such as hijacking, and stated that although he was very protective of his activities, she felt him to be extremely honest. [redacted] added [redacted] to her knowledge, had never received instruction or training in parachuting or flying.
